




When they see the process of why their parents are divorcing, they understand and are more willing to accept it but


- Children might or will reject parents after divorce or separation because they could be traumatized by the caregiver and don't want to get near or close to that individual.

What is the impact of divorce on the development of the children?

- A child could feel more a little distance from one of the parent because of a parental alienation that criticize the other parent.
- It can lead to long-lasting negative effects on the child's emotional well-being and development and this can results anxiety, depression, low self-esteem and difficulty forming secure attachments.
- When parent keep talking bad about the other parent. Over time, they will develop overly negative or distorted views of the alienated parent.

What we want to see is the respectful co-parenting and open communication because this really affects the child's well-being. It should always be the **top priority** over parent disagreements.
